### From the Desk of the Chair, Mike Scott

September opened with Keira D'Amato (1:04:29) edging Emily Sisson (1:04:35) for the win at the USATF 20K Championship in New Haven as both finished well under the previous event record of 1:05:11 set by Colleen De Reuck in 1998. Conner Mantz led most of the race to win the men's championship.

Both Stephanie Bruce (31:53) and Biya Simbassa (28:13) set new course records while winning the USATF 10K Championship hosted by the Cow Harbor 10K.

Riley Cook (38:20) and Kristen Prendergast (46:07) were fastest of the day at the USATF Masters 12K Championship in Highlands, NJ. Top aged grade performances were 67-year old Nora Cary (54:05, 93.55%) and 67-year old Rick Becker (46:34, 90.48%).

Garrett Heath (1:13:44) and Anna Dalton (1:30:17) ran away to win the USATF Half Marathon Trail Championship hosted by the Birkie Trail Run.

October features the USATF 10-Mile Championship on October 2 and the USATF Masters 5K Cross Country Championship on October 22.

Everyone's eyes were on Keira D'Amato and Emily Sisson at the start line of the **2022 USATF 20K Road National Championships** presented by Toyota and hosted by the **Faxon Law New Haven Race** on Sep. 5 in New Haven, Ct. Despite the oppressive humidity, the two women separated from the pack and the battle was on! They hit 3 miles together at 15:31. They then traded leads until Mile 8 where Keira began to pull away. Both women were in the thick of marathon training with Keira preparing to race in Berlin later in the month and Emily racing Chicago in October. In the end just 6 seconds separated the two with Keira breaking the course record set by Erika Kemp in 2021.

Friday, September 17 dawned cool and comfortable on the North Shore of Long Island.

It was the fifth time that Stephanie Bruce would toe the line at **The Great Cow Harbor 10K**, but it was the very first time in its 45 year history that it was hosting the **USATF 10K Road National Championships** presented by Toyota.

With her experience on the course Stephanie took it out conservatively and stayed that way for the first half of the race. Just before the 5K prime, there was a pack of four – Nell Rojas, Annie Frisbie, Edna Kurgat, and Stephanie. Rojas put in a little surge to take the prime, but Bruce remained unruffled. It was between miles 4 and 5 that Bruce made her move. She knew the course and she knew it was time to go. Go she did. When she hit that last mile (downhill) no one could catch her. They put their heart into it, though, and the pack of 3 that she'd left behind all broke Erika Kemp's previous course record.

A 5 KM Leader Bonus of \$500 was awarded to Nell Rojas. Chip time was used to determine the 5KM leader. It was also the case that the 5K leader needed to finish in the top 15 of their gender to realize that bonus.

#### NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP RECAP

Thrilling Races Under Challenging Conditions at the Masters 12 Km Championships

Congratulations to the Masters Athletes who earned Individual and Team Medals at the 2022 USATF Masters National 12 Km Championships on the By Hook Or By Crook course at Highlands, NJ on September 18, 2022. A record number of athletes were entered, 326, and a record number finished, 299. Weather conditions were challenging, with temperatures rising to the upper 70's by the end of the race, with humidity and double-digit winds. Two athletes who suffered from dehydration were taken after the race to a nearby hospital for observation. All athletes are currently reported to be in good health. Many others dialed back their pace over the final 2 miles to compensate. Despite the challenges, the competition was outstanding, and races highly contested.

#### OVERALL NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Men Riley Cook took it out hard from the start. Benjamin Bruce and Jesse Davis stayed with him as long as they could but Cook took the win in 38:20. It was his second Masters LDR win in as many tries; he added this to the Gold Medal he won at the Masters Ten Mile Championship in Sacramento.

Women Kristen Prendergast started out conservatively and moved up gradually through the field. She passed Fiona Bayly in Mile 6, and Sara Giroto and Abby Dean in the last mile to claim the Championship in 46:07. This was Prendergast's first Masters LDR National Championship. AGE-GRADE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS These awards identify the best performance for one's age across all age divisions.

Women The top age grade was achieved by Nora Cary, whose 54:05 at age 67, graded at 93.55%. Fiona Bayly and Suzanne La Burt followed at 90.83 and 90.62 respectively. Men In an extremely close contest, Rick Becker achieved the top score of 90.48% on a 46:34 at age 67. He was followed by Nat Larson and Brian Crowley at 90.44 and 90.41 respectively.
